
Your on Camera:



Interesting Facts. The Back to School Clothing and Footwear Allowance (BSCFA) is a payment to help families with the cost of school uniforms and shoes. Many families get the BSCFA automatically. If you are paid automatically, you don't need to apply for the BSCFA. If you don't get an automatic payment, you can apply for the payment online at MyWelfare Applications for the Back to School Clothing and Footwear Allowance opened on **12 June 2024** and will close on **30 September 2024**.

Burning of a Witch. In 1895 near Killinaule in Co. Tipperary 35-yearold Michael Cleary murdered his 26 year old wife Bridget. The couple had no children. Despite her husband's disapproval Bridget would visit her neighbours by walking through a Fairy Rath. It was believed the fairies often snatched pretty women and children and replaced them with changelings. It was believed women changelings could not bear children and so Michael came to believe that his wife had been taken by the faeries and replaced by a changeling. Believing she was no longer his wife he burned her alive with the assistance of family and friends. He was convicted of manslaughter only and served 15 years in prison before emigrating to Canada
