

Interesting Facts: Help with Funeral Costs. The Widowed or Surviving Civil Partner Grant is a once-off payment to widows/widowers/surviving civil partners with dependent children. This payment was formerly called the Widowed Parent Grant. If someone dies from an accident at work, a Funeral Grant is available. Whether you qualify or not for one of the above grants you may be eligible for an Additional Needs Payment to help with funeral costs if you are on a low income. Each case is decided on its merits. The Community Welfare Service prefers if you apply before the funeral takes place, but in practice, most people apply afterwards.

**General Election**. Exercise your right to Vote Friday November 29<sup>th</sup> Ireland uses proportional representation (PR) for voting in elections, with each voter having a single transferable vote (STV)STV would be first used at the local level in Ireland during the 1919 Sligo by-election.. Following independence, STV was adopted for Irish Free State elections in 1922 and its use was entrenched in the Irish Constitution, ratified by the people in a referendum on 1 July 1937.
