
Bicentenary Talk on the History of St. Brigid's Church




Clonegal. Dr. Kevin Whelan, a native of Clonegal and one of Ireland's best known and widely published scholars, and historians will give a presentation on the history and origins of St Brigid's Church Clonegal on Friday January 31st at 7.30pm in The Spellman Hall Kildavin. Admission is free but donations will be accepted on the night toward the refurbishment of the Parish Church. Kevin, who has always made himself available to support his native community, has been a visiting

professor at New York University, Boston College and Concordia University (Montreal). He has lectured in fourteen countries, and at the Sorbonne, Cambridge, Oxford, Torino, Berkeley, Yale, Dartmouth and Louvain. He has written or edited over twenty books and over one hundred articles on Ireland's history, geography and culture. He is currently a Michael Smurfit Director of Notre Dame University Dublin. Kevin has promised a "warts and all" history of the church.

Interesting Facts: Insurance is a contract between you and an insurance company to protect you from financial loss due to an unexpected event. like accident, illness natural disaster or other. The cost of insurance is in theory linked to the likelihood of the event occurring, the less likely the less costly. Where an event is very likely to happen, it may prove difficult or impossible to ensure against it. Insurance companies only make a profit if the value of premium significantly exceeds the value of claims paid out. Remember to look at the terms and conditions of your policy if you don't comply with these, it may invalidate the policy. In some circumstances there may be more than one party claimed against in the event of an incident, example a property owner and a property hirer and a property user. Therefore, it is important to remember that if multiple parties are part of an unexpected incident, it is desirable all have insurance.
